Where do big pumpkins come from?

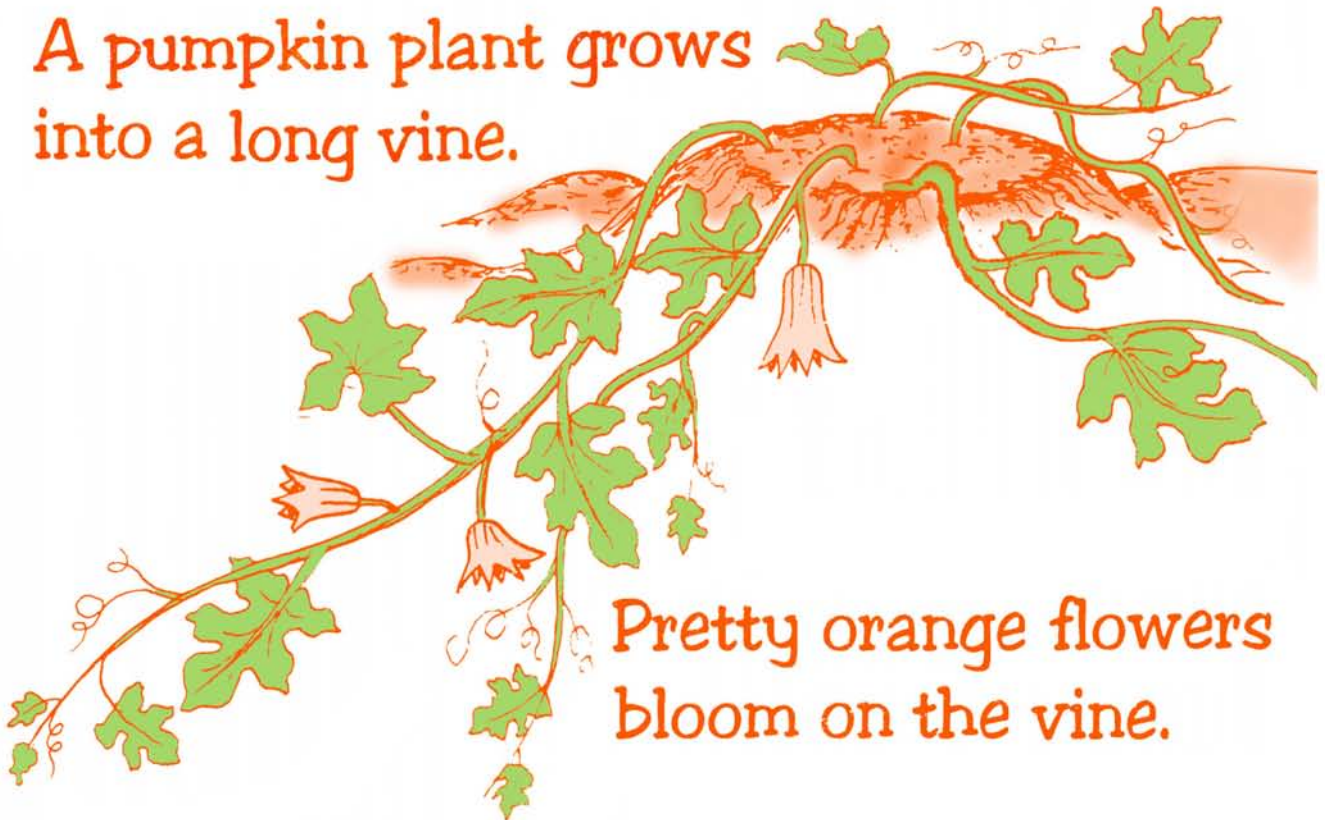
Pumpkins start like this.

Little pumpkins begin to grow.

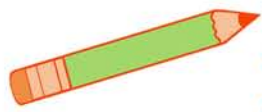


The pumpkins grow bigger
